8. BOARD MEMBER CODE OF ETHICS

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfield Board of Education adopts the Purpose and Role of the Code of Ethics N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24.1.

The members of the Board of Education recognize that they hold authority not as individuals but as members of the Board. In order to make a clear public statement of its philosophy of service to the pupils of the district, the Board adopts this code of ethics:

- 1. I will uphold and enforce all laws, rules, and regulations of the State Board of Education and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes shall be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.
- 2. I will make decisions in terms of the educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools, which meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex, or social standing.
- 3. I will confine my Board action to policy-making, planning, and appraisal; and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the Board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
- 4. I will carry out my responsibility not to administer the schools, but together with my fellow Board members, to see that they are well run.
- 5. I will recognize that authority rests with the Board of Education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the Board.
- 6. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
- 7. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools, which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow Board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its schools.
- 8. I will vote to appoint the best-qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the Chief Administrative Officer.
- 9. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
- 10. I will refer all complaints to the Chief Administrative Officer and will act on the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.

Mr. Egan asked the Superintendent a series of questions.

Brian Egan stated that at the start of the school year third grade moved from Stevenson School to Churchill School. Mr. Egan asked Dr. Ciccotelli how the move was going. The Superintendent stated that Mr. Santana said the children have transitioned very well and they really are enjoying their new home.

Mr. Egan stated that in order to accommodate the third grade students, fifth grade was moved into the trailers. He asked how that move was going. Dr. Ciccotelli informed him that the students' transition was great and the light switches for the trailers were changed during winter break. Dr. Ciccotelli also mentioned that the District received quotes for the security cameras; and we are just waiting for them to be installed.

Brian Egan asked how Stevenson School is functioning on available space. Dr. Ciccotelli stated that all specials are off the cart and are assigned to a classroom. There are no extra rooms available. Dr. Ciccotelli responded that if we continue to receive an increase of Preschool students (students that are aged out of state programs), the District will have to revisit organization in that area.

Lastly, Mr. Egan asked how the District is handling the increase of small group instruction in the schools. The Superintendent responded that they are able to house all instruction and are doing very well; however, there is no extra space at Stevenson School. The schedules are made to reduce conflict with the shared spaces. Dr. Ciccotelli stated that Churchill School has instruction in every possible place. The classes are very crowded.
